AUGUST 2000 MEETING

We had an excellent attendance of around 45 for the Annual Meeting and 6/8 contest. The Annual Meeting is covered in the Minutes and Financial Statement which are published elsewhere in this newsletter.

The competition began just before 9.00pm following the meeting. Your scribe was the judge for the evening. Doug Thoresen immediately shouldered his new presidential responsibilities by conducting the meeting and Bob Payne was the steward for the evening, keeping up a steady supply of players.

We had an excellent entry of seven players. Some consideration was given to dividing the contest into senior and junior sections but it was decided to have an "all in" contest.

The first player was Cael Wright and his tunes were *Allan Stuart* and *Dr Ross*. Cael's drones were a little out from the beginning and his pipe may have been a bit strong as we heard a little unsteady blowing as he went on. His tunes were musically expressed and his execution was generally good. However there was some minor variations in tempo and a few small errors crept in later in his performance.

Next was Nathan Bedford, playing *John Barclay* and *Braemar Gathering*. His pipe was excellent and was well blown throughout and he played at a steady tempo. I thought the music was a little forced--the tempo was perhaps a touch slow and the measures were not clearly "finished off". As he went on his fingers tightened up a bit and there were a few crossing sounds but apart from that his execution was very good.

Steve Taylor played next and his tunes were *Angus MacKinnon* and *Tug Argan Gap*. Steve has improved each time we hear him and this was no exception. His pipes were good apart from high A being a bit inconsistent (blowing?) His execution was good, perhaps a bit tight at times, probably from nerves. He played carefully but with good musical expression. Unfortunately he broke down in the second part of the second tune.

Phil Cowan came next, with *Ballochyle* and *Ellen-Orr*. His pipes were well blown throughout but the drones were just a little off right from the start. His execution was good apart from a couple of small slips and he played musically, with good definition of phrases and marking off the end of measures. There was just a little bit of inconsistent tempo. The drones being off seemed to unsettle his performance a bit.

Corey Dale was the next player and he gave us *Duncan McGillivray* and *Glendaruel Highlanders*. This was a confident performance on a good sounding bagpipe. Apart from one small slip the execution was very good throughout. His blowing was a little unsteady right at the beginning but settled down very well. He brought out the 6/8 feel very well with excellent phrasing.

Lea Ahokava played *Isabel T McDonald* and *Duncan McGillivray*. His pipes were fairly good but the top hand was a little suspect and he had a very noticeable choke. His execution was excellent and the tunes were generally correctly phrased, apart from a tendency to play the last phrase of the measure no differently from the others. He also gained a little tempo from start to finish.

Finally we heard from Matthew Supranowicz, playing *McNeill of Ugadale* and *Jean Mauchline*. Matthew had a somewhat stronger bagpipe than we are used to hearing him play. The drones were not quite right from the start. He played at a good steady tempo and his expression improved as he went on after starting out a bit flat. There were a few errors in his execution.

After some deliberation the results were announced as follows:

3. Phil Cowan
4. Nathan Bedford

In commenting on the performances, I said that the judge's role in a contest like this is not an enviable one as one needs to look for all the little errors (as chronicled above), rather than just listen to the music, which is usually pretty pleasurable when listening to 6/8's. The other point is that 6/8's, being easier to play than some types of tunes are perhaps easier to play well but also sometimes trap those who take them too lightly. They also show up both a good and a poor bagpipe really well!

Also, apart from the characteristic three note groups which need to be played correctly, there is the need to avoid too much sameness in phrasing and ensure that the final phrases of the measures really finish off the musical sentences.

Lower Clarence Lose Their Chief--Bob MacPherson advises of the passing of Colin George Gregor, Chief of the Lower Clarence Scottish Society at Maclean....."Colin became terminally ill early this year and recently entered the Lismore Base Hospital for treatment of a leg clot, which resulted in amputation. His wish to return to Maclean hospital was granted and after a short stay of only a few days Colin peacefully passed away on the 30th August. His funeral was held in the Maclean Free Presbyterian Church, Saturday 2nd September, 2000. The funeral service was a fitting tribute to the life of Colin Gregor, who will be missed by the Scottish fraternity and the many other organisations that Colin served. He leaves behind a family of two sons, Bruce and David and their families."

Bob gave an address at the funeral and has kindly supplied us with a copy which we can make available to members if requested. An edited version follows:

"Colin was known Nationally and Internationally as the Chief of the Lower Clarence Scottish Association Incorporated. He was also a foundation member and Patron of Maclean - The Scottish Town in Australia. He was a strong supporter and much loved by the pupils of the Janet North/Gray and Barbara McLachlan Highland Dancing Studios and the Maclean Scottish Country Dancers. Colin was also known throughout the Australian Pipe Bands movement and Piping Societies as a competing bandsmen and Judge. Colin took a keen interest in the building of the memorial Scottish Cairn in Maclean

He was also known by the farming industry as a successful sugar cane grower, and appointed life member of the Lower Clarence Agricultural Society. Colin was a very keen Poultry breeder and become one of the national leading Rhode Island Red breeders.

Colin was a member of various community organisations. During his wife's long illness Colin remained a loving carer and later a keen supporter of the "Friends of Mareeba" Nursing Home.

The life of Colin George Gregor began at the wee village of Tyndale on 8th October 1914 when he was born the third child of Donald Munro Gregor and Margaret McPherson. His great grandparents were all born in Scotland and migrated to Australia during the 19th century. They settled on the Clarence and purchased their farming property in 1857.

Colin was taken to Band practice as an 8 year old by his father who taught him the pipes, Colin went on to learn the side drum and was tutored by the late Jim Cavello on his return from world War 2, when Colin served his country in the 2/2nd Battalion.

Colin married his bride Ailsa Gordon, at Grafton and settled on the family farm at Tyndale and raised their family. It was at this time that Colin became active again in the community and became Drum Major of the Maclean and District Pipe Band, went on to receive his certificate as a Dress and Drill judge, became life member of the Lower Clarence Scottish Society and in recognition of his many years of loyal serve was given the honour to officially open the 89th Maclean Highland Gathering in 1993, the centenary year of the society. This year the Lower Clarence Scottish Society celebrated its first gathering in the new millennium and it was also Colin's year to announce his retirement as chief of the Society.

As a fitting tribute to Colin's long involvement with the Maclean and District Pipe Band, a pipe tune composed by band member Ross McLachlan, called "Chieftain Colin Gregor", was played at the official opening.

Two years ago, Colin fulfilled a life long dream to tour the Scottish Highlands, made possible by his caring family. Whilst in Scotland he attended the annual gathering of Clan Gregor in Perthshire. Colin always had a passion to live by the river and after his return from the Isle of Skye he took great pride in calling his present home "Camus mor", a Gaelic name meaning a 'bay of great water' and from his front verandah Colin enjoyed such views each day. His garden was a show of flowers and he picked and shared many vegetables with his neighbours. Colin was a man with an eye for meticulous detail and took great pride in all of his undertakings in many societies. He had this very pleasing and caring manner and you always felt blessed by his presence."
