FEBRUARY 2006 MEETING

Our first meeting of 2006 attracted about thirty piping enthusiasts.

President Reg O'Malley introduced the evening and mentioned the Order of Australia award received by Margaret Paterson.

Our first player was Vic McKay. He apologised in advance for his for "puny pipes" but they weren't too bad in any case. He played a new composition of his own and said he would get Maurie DeHayr to reveal the name of it at the end. When this was done, it was revealed that it was called *Alex & Desley McConnell*. He presented a copy of the music to Alex and Desley.

The next piper was Peter Burrows. His tunes included *PB's Tuning Phrase, Duncan MacNeill of Melfort, The Ewe Wi' the Crookit Horn, The Piper's Bonnet, The Wee Cobbler, The Sound of Sleat* (Donald MacKinnon), *Alistair & Debbie, Macleod Of Dunvegan* (air). *P/M George Allan, and finally The Clumsy Lover* (with lots of extra parts).

The next player was Frank Moody. the drones were a bit out from the start but he gave a good confident performance. His tunes included *Thomas Sanders, Leaving Liverpool, Bonnie Lass of Fyvie, Cockney Jocks, Highland Wedding, Maggie Cameron, High Road to Linton and Jock Wilson's Ball*.

After a short break we heard from Iain Bruce. He had a very nice bagpipe as usual. He started out with the 6/8s *Bonawe Highlanders and Monte Cassino*. Then we heard the 2/4s *The Braes of Busby and Dr E G MacKinnon*, strathspey *Highland Harry* and reel *The Man from Glengarry*. He finished with the Piobaireachd *Fair Honey*.

Our last player was Malcolm McRae. On a very nice pipe, he gave us some good solid tunes including 6/8s and an MSR set. He finished up with the Piobaireachd *Lament for Mary MacLeod*.

Apart from the supper, the final event for the evening was to draw the raffle.

Piobaireachd Club

The March meeting of the Piobaireachd Club had a good attendance of 15, numbers being down as several of our regulars were in Melbourne for the weekend attending the Australian Pipe Band Championships.

After apologies were notified Malcolm McRae introduced Yasu Hamilton who played 'Glengarry's Lament' after the history of the tune was read from Roy Gunn's book by Maurie DeHayr - This was a very creditable performance from the young lass and we look forward to hearing more from her as she progresses in piping.

Iain Bruce was next to play; his tune being 'Isabel MacKay' (reading by Greg Boyle) as usual we received a very musical tune from Iain reflecting his study and dedication to this music.

Another Iain - Iain Davidson - was the third player of the morning playing 'The Old Woman's Lullaby' (reading by Alastair McInnes). He started confidently but ran into some difficulty and stopped. He then played the Ground of 'The Lament for the Children'.

'Macleod of Rassay's Salute' was the tune chosen by Peter Burrows for his performance, the reading of the history being done by Gary Forno.

Alastair McInnes, making a pilgrimage from his home in Grafton then gave us 'Lady Margaret MacDonald's Salute' (reading by Bob Payne). This tune has some very interesting passages which Alastair exploited well.

After a break for morning tea the tune for the month, 'Black Donald's March' was discussed and after

some explanatory comments from Malcolm regarding the history and different styles of playing it the tune was sung through - we are getting over our inhibitions and the singing has really improved - Malcolm then played the tune through and finished with a few more comments regarding it.

The group then discussed the past year's programme and thoughts for future progress of the club.

Whilst all were very happy with the past year's efforts there were opportunities for further ideas and progress to help both players and enthusiasts gain more from the monthly meetings.

Some comments expressed:-

- As it is impossible to get the complete way of the tune at one hearing all should bring a small recorder and take time to really study the tune at home
- Would meeting twice a month be better? - General opinion was that once a month was perhaps sufficient as time was important to people and individual regularity of attendance would surely suffer
- Commence meeting at 9.00a.m. and **devote** first hour to learners with help from established players to add encouragement - It was decided to seek approval from the school for the earlier start

After expressing out thanks to Stephanie MacRae for stepping in and looking after our refreshments the meeting was then concluded with Alastair McInnes playing one of Donald MacLeod's tunes 'The Lament for the Rowan Tree'.

Piobaireachd Group Changes

The Piobaireachd Group has decided to start its meetings an hour earlier (at 9am) to provide an opportunity for novices to be given some guidance on playing, instruments, tuning etc.

We are inviting less experienced players to take advantage of assistance which will be available from Roy Gunn, Ian Bruce or Malcolm McRae.

From about 10am onwards the aim will be to make the floor available to better players, who will also be urged to keep tuning times to a minimum, with the expectation that those who wish to play will be able to do so more than once.

Ideally, if the better players can play at least twice, that should result in a more satisfying morning for them and for the listeners.

HOW TO GET TO THE BALMORAL BOWLS CLUB

For those who like to work out their own directions the UBD Reference is Map 160, Q12.

From the Gateway Arterial—turn north at the Lytton Road intersection (just south of the bridge), travel along Route 24 and the Route 23 (Wynnum Road) till you see the Morningside RSL on your left. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

From the City—go across the Story Bridge, left into Shafston Avenue, then into Lytton Road and Wynnum Road (Route 23). Go along Wynnum Road until you see the Morningside RSL on your right. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

From the west (old Cleveland Road)—Turn into Bennetts Road. Continue along Bennetts Road, across the railway line and a park will appear on your right. Jean Howie Drive goes through the park (the entrance to the drive is near the boundary of the Bulimba Cemetery). Go about 350 metres along the Drive and turn right into the Bowls Club car park.

Contest Conditions

1. By entering this competition, the entrants will be deemed to agree with these Conditions.
2. The Promoter is the Maryborough Caledonian Society....
3. This contest will be conducted under Pipe Band Australia Rules and entry into the State Championships is open to bands people registered with a state branch of the PBA or affiliated association.
4. All entries must be received on or before June 1, 2006
5. Competitors may only compete in their registered grade or on grade above. In the event of large numbers of entries, the Promoters reserve the right to decline entries of competitors entering above their registered grade.
6. Entries into the Mini Band Sections are only for bands that are unable to field a full band.
7. Correct Highland or registered band uniforms must be worn while competing and collecting prizes or trophies. Pipers accompanying solo drummers must also wear Highland dress or registered band uniform. Baseball Caps or Polo Shirts are not acceptable.
8. There must be at least three competitors in each solo event and 2 in each band event otherwise event may be cancelled. If there are fewer than 6 nominations in a solo contest, 1st and 2nd only will be awarded.
9. Solo competitors are to register with the marshal or the judge of an event prior to the event commencing.
10. Fine tuning permitted (2 minutes maximum) in front of judges in solo competitions.

11. All trophies are to be collected on the day unless other arrangements have been made.
