MAY 2006 MEETING

The attendance at our June Meeting for the Patron's Trophy contest was about 30. President Reg O'Malley started the evening off with some news. He read out the apologies (Maurie DeHayr, Iain Bruce (mother just out of hospital), Malcolm McRae (Sydney), Roy Gunn, Bob Payne, Ian Davidson) and gave some of the history of the Patron's trophy.

He also mentioned the Celtic Celebration Committee Contest results, and congratulated Margaret Paterson on her Celtic and Australian Honours.

He then introduced Donald Galloway as the judge for the Patron's trophy contest, making the comment that this contest was established by Donald's father, Archie, when Archie was Patron of the Society. Donald has kindly provided the following notes of the contest:

The Patron's Trophy Competition, May 2006

It was my pleasure to judge the Annual Patron's Trophy competition for senior players at the May meeting of the Society.

With the final of the Celtic Celebration Committee Competition being run on the previous Saturday, I thought there might be a rush of entries with pipers taking the opportunity to "refine" their tune sets in preparation for the State Championships in Maryborough coming up in the middle of June, but it wasn't to be. Nevertheless, it was a great night of piping and the three competitors who presented themselves gave excellent and very entertaining performances.

The Patron's Trophy competition is restricted to Intermediate and Open level and the set piece is a March, Strathspey and Reel of the competitor's choosing.

Matthew Supranowicz was the first to play and he selected **Captain**

Campbell of Drum a Voisk, The Shepherd's Crook and The Grey Bob. Matthew's bagpipe was nicely balanced and well tuned. Matthew played to his usual high standard, however I thought his fingering technique let him down just a wee bit on this occasion.

Vaughn Parker was the next to play and he selected **Southall, The Shepherd's Crook and John Morrison of Assynt House.** Vaughn's bagpipe was nicely tuned and produced a balanced sound, albeit a rather robust tone from his bass drone. Vaughn played his tunes with nice lift however his performance was slightly marred by a lack of clean fingering technique at times and an uncharacteristic choke in the reel.

Tom Campbell was the final competitor and his tunes were **Hugh Kennedy, Caber Feidh and John Morrison of Assynt House.** Tom's performance was executed with nice crisp fingering and good expression and played on a nicely tuned and well balanced, more mellow sounding bagpipe.

When it came to the final result, I considered all three competitors played to a high standard, however Tom's performance was definitely deserving of first place. Matthew I placed second and Vaughn third.

Although it was a little disappointing that there were not more competitors, I'm sure all who were present enjoyed the night's competition and, like me, look forward to hearing more from these three competitors in the future.

The results were announced to applause and the prize winners presented with their cheques.

Tom Campbell then played a few more tunes including the 6/8 *An Eilean Ard*, strathspey *Braes of Mar*, reels *Duke of Hamilton's Rell*,

Marion and Donald and *Highland Reel*, air *Come Hasten With Me*, hornpipe *The Drunken Landlady*, jig *The Lark in the Morning* and the $\frac{3}{4}$ *Colin's Cattle*.

Matthew Supranowicz also played but the list of his tunes has disappeared.

Finally Vaughn Parker played again with tunes including *Bruce Gandy's Farewell to the Iron Horse*, some 4/4 marches, *Clumsy Lover*, *Glasgow Police Pipers* and the ground of the piobaireachd *Salute to Donald*. Reg

mentioned that Vaughn had done very well in his events at the R U Brown contest in Adelaide (see results later in this newsletter).

Finally, Tom was presented the Patron's Trophy with much ceremony.

All that remained before supper was to draw the raffle. As well as the usual bottle of whisky we had a jar of cumquat jam made by Eileen MacKay. Tom Campell made the first draw and the winner was Lorna Burrows. Lorna drew the second prize which was won by Vik Supranowicz.

Piobaireachd Club

Attendance was low at our June meeting owing to illness and several of our regulars having to go to Toowoomba for the Ipswich Band Tattoo on the previous night (couldn't get up early on Sunday).

However, there was some good playing during the session, which commenced with Roy Gunn playing the *Lament for Rory MacLoud* after which Bob Payne gave us the historical reading of the tune.

Iain Bruce was next playing *MacLeod of Colbeck's Lament* – a John MacKay of Raasay composition and indeed a more modern tune – again the notes to the tune were read by Bob Payne.

The set tune *Struan Robertson's Salute* was then presented in the format used by Dr Roderick Ross in the Binneas is Borerai Collection and discussed by both Roy and Iain, after which we sang it through.

Iain Bruce then played the tune, bringing out all the light and shade previously discussed.

Roy Gunn was then persuaded to give another tune, this time *The Lament for the Children*, which was well received by the audience.

The session was then concluded with Iain playing *Catherine's Lament*.

HOW TO GET TO THE BALMORAL BOWLS CLUB

For those who like to work out their own directions the UBD Reference is Map 160, Q12.

From the Gateway Arterial—turn north at the Lytton Road intersection (just south of the bridge), travel along Route 24 and the Route 23 (Wynnum Road) till you see the Morningside RSL on your left. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

From the City—go across the Story Bridge, left into Shafston Avenue, then into Lytton Road and Wynnum Road (Route 23). Go along Wynnum Road until you see the Morningside RSL on your right. Turn in as if going to the RSL but go right through their carpark and continue along Jean Howie Drive for about 350 metres. Turn left into the Bowls Club car park.

From the west (old Cleveland Road)—Turn into Bennetts Road. Continue along Bennetts Road, across the railway line and a park will appear on your right. Jean Howie Drive goes through the park (the entrance to the drive is near the boundary of the Bulimba Cemetery). Go about 350 metres along the Drive and turn right into the Bowls Club car park.

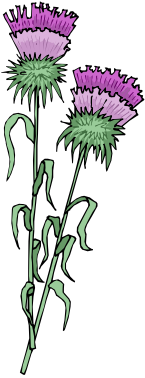
