We're still finalising the rest of the program for the year. However, it is likely that most of our "permanent fixtures" will stay as usual. These include:

- ◆ After each competition, the floor is open for all as at a Pipers' Night.
  - ◆ The aim is to start meetings at 7.30pm (7.15pm for a 7.30pm start) to allow an early finish/more piping/more social time at the end of the meeting. Junior competitions are to start promptly and finish by 8.30pm.

## FEBRUARY MEETING

There were about 30 in attendance for our February meeting. President Reg O'Malley introduced the evening and gave a progress report on Maurie DeHay who is now out of hospital and doing well. Vic McKay spoke and proposed a vote of commendation to Jordan Whicker for the article he had written in the newsletter about his experiences at the New Zealand Summer School as a scholarship winner from the Pipe Band Association. Seconded by Rog Grogan and carried with acclamation.

Our judge for the Hornpipe and Jig contest was Iain Bruce. The first competitor in the junior section was Kirby Douglas and his tunes were *The Walrus* and *Under Pressure*. Next was Rylie Douglas and her tunes were the same

In the senior section we had three competitors. First to play was Wayne Kennedy and his tunes were *Donald MacLeod* and *Barbara's Jig*. Tom McGirr played next and his tunes were *The Tourist* and *Emancipation*. Our final competitor was Ross Campbell and he was to play *Tam Bain's Lum* and *Troy's Wedding* but unfortunately set out on his other hornpipe, *Train Journey North*, and stopped at the end of it when he realised what he had done. A pity, because he was going well!

After Iain Bruce had finished his deliberations, the results were as follows.

Iain Bruce made some comments on the playing and on hornpipes and jigs generally. Following the announcement of the results, we had an early supper so that the Junior competitors could get away to Warwick.

Following supper we had some more piping. First, Tam McGirr, along with Kirby and Rylie Douglas, played us a selection including *Scotland the Brave*, *Marie's Wedding*, *Green Hills*, *When the Battle's O'er*, *High Road to Gairloch* and *Brown Haired Maiden*.

Malcolm MacRae was the next piper and his selection included the slow air *The Cairn on the Hill*, 6/8 P/M *Sam Scott*, 2/4 *The Atholl Highlanders March to Loch Katrine*, strathspey *The Caledonian Canal*, reel *Alick Cameron*, slow air *The Herding Song* and jig *Lord Dunmore*.

Wayne Kennedy was next to play and couldn't remember the names of some of his tunes but his selection did include *The Big Birl*, *The Bulgarian Bandit* and *Gravel Walk*.

Iain Bruce provided as usual an interesting selection including the air *Is It Lonely You are?*, the 6/8 *Lady Diana Spencer's Welcome to Deeside*, 2/4s *The Captain's March* and *Bob Browns's Farewell to the Ballochbuie Forest*, strathspey *Lady Loudon* and reel *The Grey Bob*.

The final piper for the night was Ross Campbell, and his tunes included the slow air *Ross & Robyn Campbell*, jig *Brownie's Blue Brozzie*, 2/4 march *Major Manson at Clachantrushal* and the MSR set *Hugh Kennedy*, *Piper's Bonnet* and *Thomson's Dirk*.

All in all, a quite satisfying night of piping.

## Piobaireachd Group

We started with a very small group of six at the March meeting. Perhaps preparations for the New Zealand Pipe Band Championships the following weekend or Maclean at Easter were keeping people away. We had apologies from Ian Davidson, Yasu Hamilton and Roy Gunn.

Maocolm McRae was the first to get his pipes out and after warming up with some light music he played *The Pretty Dirk*.

Ross Campbell was next with *Clan Chattan's Gathering* following some warm up tunes.

At this point Vaughn Parker arrived to make up seven.

Your scribe then read the stories of *Clan Chattan* and *Clan Ranalds Salute*, which was the tune played by our next piper, Iain Bruce.

Vaughn Parker was the next player but I don't have a note of what his tune was.

We then went through the set tune for the day, *Catherine's Lament*. Malcolm said the way it is represented in the MacArthur/MacGregor manuscript is very similar to how it is played today. It needs to be learned as a song so is good for beginners.

After a break for morning tea, Malcolm played the tune on the pipe.

Ross was next to be persuaded to play and he started out on his tune but reverted to *Catherine's Lament*, no doubt because of recently hearing and singing it.

Vaughn then played *Glengarry's March*. Malcolm read the story of the tune.

Finally Iain Bruce played a nameless tune from the Campbell Cantaireachd.

Both days of the Gathering were mostly fine and events generally ran very well to time. As usual many old acquaintances were renewed and new ones formed.

I was able to listen to most of the band contest and the standard at the top of Grade 4 was quite good. Also it was good to see Sandy Dalziel leading the Band from Scots PGC at Warwick back into the contest field. I think hardly anyone presently in the Band had ever played in a Band contest but they generally produced a good sound, played at a sensible tempo and played tunes within their capabilities to come in the middle of the field. It just shows what can be done with a group of young learning players with the right guidance.

Grade 3 was also generally quite good and the the winning performance by Queensland Highlanders No 1 in Grade 1 was, apart from a couple of technical glitches, of a high tonal and musical standard.

In the solos, I only got to listen to the Open Piobaireachd on Friday night. There were a number of unfinished tunes but the more disappointing aspect was that there were a number of bagpipes that were quite harsh in sound. This certainly takes away from the "big music". The hall in which the contest is held is not ideal for a big-sounding pipe but even so the essential resonant sound of the bagpipe needs to show through to make a performance likely to place in the prize list.
