JULY MEETING

As usual, our July meeting featured the annual Jimmy Durham Memorial contest for junior players. We had an excellent turnout of about 45 people, including 8 competitors. It was good to see Robroy and Isobel MacGregor at the Society for the first time in many years. Rob is currently teaching Mitchell Durham, one of the competitors for the night.

President Donald Galloway opened the meeting and asked all to stand while Chloe Whyte played a lament for Harry MacKenzie, who had passed away since our previous meeting.

Apologies were received from Tom McGirr and our "doorman" Jack Grant, who was unfortunately in hospital.

Donald then introduced our Patron Maurie DeHayr, as judge for the night and the contest got underway. The test piece is a 4 part 2/4 March and the competitors and their tunes, in order of play, were:
