SEPTEMBER MEETING

Our September meeting was well attended, with about 40 members and others present. It was of course the annual meeting night and the minutes of that meeting are printed elsewhere in this newsletter.

Following the annual meeting, Donald Galloway welcomed everyone and handed over to Andrew Roach who was MC for the Air and Jig competition. Our judge for the evening was Jason Palfrey. There followed a round of applause for the competitors and the judge. The raffle was drawn and Donald closed the meeting and welcomed all to supper.

Piobaireachd Group

The October meeting was very well supported, with 14 in attendance, including quite a few ready to play. One of the lures appeared to be the chance to try out their tunes for the Piobaireachd Recital Day next month.

Peter Hurwood led off with the MacKay setting of *Lord Lovat's Lament*, giving us an informative talk about the tune before playing it on a very nice sounding pipe. He was followed by Nick Brightman with his first venture into playing at the Piobaireachd Group. His tune was *Glengarry's Lament*. His pipe was steady and apart from a little difficulty with the Taorluath and Crunluath variations he put in a creditable first effort.

Ross Campbell went though the list so far assembled for the Piobaireachd Recital Day and then he played *Black Donald's March*. He warned beforehand that he had been having difficulties with the changing altitude between Toowoomba and Brisbane but in the event the pipe went very well. When tuning up he played the air *Blink Bonnie*. The version of Black Donald's march he played was the one he circulated last month, which includes an extra variation.

He then played the *Rout of Glenfruin*, following the way of a recording of it by Bruce Gandy. He commented that it was a musical tune and also easy to memorise as it is primary in form.

Bruce McLeod was next to step up and his tune was *Lament for Alisdair Dearg MacDonnell of Glengarry*. Despite a little trouble in the Taorluath and Crunluath, again a good effort for one who has only played Piobaireachd in front of an audience a few times.

Ian Yardley was the next player with *Struan Robertson's Salute*. Unfortunately he had a fairly hard new reed in his chanter and suffered the dreaded lip failure problem part way through the tune but was doing quite well apart from that.

We then broke for morning tea and Ross Campbell helped Ian Yardley to get his pipes to a more manageable state.

First up after morning tea was Kathy Herzig. Kathy was originally taught by Donald McKinnon but unfortunately never progressed to the stage of playing the pipes in solos at that time, and then had to give piping away for a long time. She has been bringing herself up to speed with the help of Maurie DeHayr and was now confident enough to have a go at the *Lament for the Old Sword* as her first ever time of playing the pipes solo for an audience! Apart from some memory problems where she seemed to be groping for the next note in the variations this was a very creditable performance on a pretty good pipe. Her piobaireachd fingerwork was excellent with a clear rippling Crunluath and all the simpler movements of a very high standard. The only thing that needed a bit of work was the birl and there was some discussion as to how she could fix it.

Lachlan McPhee then played *Too Long in this Condition* in a capable style on a good pipe, as we are coming to expect from him.

Finally Peter Hurwood played *Catherine's Lament* which went quite well apart from some untidiness in the Crunluath a Mach.

Maurie closed the meeting by reminding everyone of the extended times next month with the Recital Day and also of the need to bring lunch if you want to eat!

Vale Angus MacLellan+ 1936,2013

Angus died on 12 October.

While one of the top solo players with most of the top honours to his credit, he also served as Pipe Sergeant of the Glasgow Police for many years. Although combining solos and pipe bands is quite common now, at that time this was most uncommon.

He was taught originally by his father, and later by Alex McIntyre. After a stint in the Merchant Navy, he joined the Glasgow Police and was with them till his retirement in 1990. During his solo career he had much tuition from Donald Macleod and became a great link to the teaching of John MacDonald of Inverness.

He won the Gold Medal at Oban in 1973 and at Inverness in 1976, taught extensively at the College of Piping and travelled to numerous piping summer schools throughout North America.

President's Annual Report - Sept 2013

At last year's annual meeting, I reported that I sensed a certain momentum was happening within the Pipers' Society and this I felt, was due in no small part to the introduction of some new ideas to our monthly meetings.

In January this year, the Management Committee of Maurie De Hayr, Alex McConnell, Andrew Roach and I met to map out a program for the year. I think it is fair to say, that all the Committee members realised that to continue to stimulate interest in the Society meetings for both players and the audience, and to maintain any momentum, it was important to explore some new strategies and build on the platform set last year.

With this in mind, it was agreed to invite some bands from in and around Brisbane to come along to our meetings and entertain the audience with a night of "featured pipers". This to be interspersed with the Society's long standing competitions; the Patrons Trophy, the Jimmy Durham Memorial competition, the Air and Jig competition, the Jack McCandlish Trophy competition and the recently announced Julie Appleton-Seymour competition to be held next month.

Looking back over the year, I think it is true to say that this format has proved popular and has brought a variety of entertainment to the Society's meetings which has been enjoyed and appreciated by all who have attended. Meeting attendances throughout the year have averaged about twenty four and I'm hopeful that number will grow in the future.

The decision was also made when planning the program to continue with awarding points to placegetters and participants in each competition during the year to encourage players at all levels to participate. As it did last year, this system of accumulating points will culminate at the end of the year with substantial prizes being awarded to the Junior and Senior Piper of the Year.

Again it has been encouraging to see the number of junior and senior competitors who have supported the Society's competitions throughout the year. However with competitor's numbers being low on a couple of occasions, this I feel is an area where looking for ways to engender more interest from competitors will need to be a priority for the incoming Management Committee.

I should at this point, also acknowledge the efforts of the tutors, particularly with preparing the junior players for the different competitions during the year.

Again there are a number of people I am indebted to who have assisted me during the year, particularly over the last three months with running the meetings whilst my wife Elizabeth and I were overseas.

I speak of Alex McConnell, our Secretary/Treasurer for his tireless efforts in publishing the Newsletter each month and keeping track of the Society's funds, despite undergoing a major medical procedure. His wife Desley, for her contribution in ensuring everything is prepared for supper each month and organising the raffle prizes.

Of all the people who have assisted with the suppers throughout the year by bringing along food for all to enjoy.

Of Jack Grant who, despite ongoing health issues, has conscientiously attended to the door duties at our meetings.

Of Maurie De Hayr, who has become an integral part of the Society over many years, and Andrew Roach, who with his experience, have both assisted and supported me by making sure things ran smoothly each month. And the judges who have given of their time to come along to the meetings and adjudicate at the different competitions. To all these people I wish to express my heartfelt thanks and appreciation.

Of course this report would not be complete without acknowledging the Piobaireachd Group and the work that has been done by Ross Campbell, Maurie De Hayr, Alex McConnell and others during the year to ensure the smooth running of the monthly meetings leading up to the Recital in November. At the end of my report, Maurie De Hayr will provide a brief report on the Piobaireachd Group.

Finally, as we look to the future, I think it's important that we always strive to improve on the way we run the Society and do things more effectively. In that way, we can go a long way to ensuring a strong future for the Society as an organisation whose principal aim is to promote the playing of the great highland bagpipe, and one which continues to encourage the bringing together of like minded people and their love for the music.
