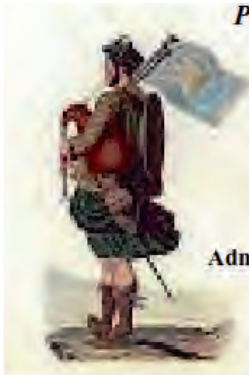

Finally we had a shorter selection from Stuart Liddell in a slightly lighter vein but again with fantastic technique and musicality on an excellent pipe.

Donald Galloway arranged the drawing of the raffle and then called for a final round of applause for all the pipers, including the competitors and our visitors. By the time supper was finished we had run a full hour over our usual time and it was 11pm!

Certainly a night of piping to be remembered including two double gold medallists in Stuart and Callum and a piper testing the edges in Kyle.

There was a good attendance of ten people at our October Meeting and the first to play was Peter Hurwood with *Donald of Laggan*. He was using his Naill pipes which he had got going as he is about to do some travelling and they are much lighter than the pipes he normally uses. Ross Campbell made some comments on his playing of the tune. Next Bruce McLeod played *Struan Robertson's Salute* and again Ross gave a constructive critique.

Ross was next to play and gave us *Battle of Waternish*.

The set tune was next, *Clan Ranald's Salute*. Ross went through the notes he had provided, emphasising some subtle aspects of the timing of the tune, especially in Variation II and its doubling. He sang it as far as the Leamluath Doubling.

After a break for morning tea, Ross played the tune on the pipe.

The next tune was played by Andrew McCabe with *MacIntosh's Lament*.

He was followed by Fraser Bolton who has started to learn *The Red Speckled Bull*. He had heard Angus McColl play it a couple of times in Scotland and had always been fascinated by it. He emphasised he had only played it a couple of times on the pipe and unfortunately went off early in the tune. We look forward to hearing it in the future. To replace it he played another tune, the name of which appears to have escaped.

Peter Hurwood then came back for a second tune and played *The Company's Lament* followed by Tom McGirr with *Battle of the Bridge of Perth*.

Ross thanked everyone for their attendance and a good day of tunes. he urged everyone to finalise their tunes for the recital at next month's meeting as soon as possible.

Ross has subsequently advised that we have a full card of players and tunes for the recital, including Brett Tidswell coming from Adelaide (sponsored by the Society of St Andrew of Scotland (Qld)), so it should be an excellent day.
